# **Together**

ALLNE, NfLNE and partners are once again organising an annual European Day of Languages writing competition for Schools, and in 2024 it is once more open to the whole country!

The organising committee invites language learners **in any key stage** to create a piece of text in a language they are learning on the theme:

# **Together**

We think that younger language learners might explore the theme by :

imagining and illustrating words they know, putting *together* e.g. two different creatures to make a new one (English example: a Catosaurus Rex, a Fishephant)

or describing colour-mixing (English example: Red together with Yellow makes Orange)

or showing (in written form) what happens when we link numbers *together* with different mathematical signs (English example: Two times Three equals Six; Two plus Three equals Five)

or any other interpretation of putting things together.

Linguistically more skilled learners might approach the theme by thinking

of things they enjoy doing together with family or friends, in teams or musical groups

of things that have been achieved by people working together

of instructions on how to put something together

etc.

The judges are always amazed at the range of interpretations learners bring to the theme!

#### There will be certificates and prizes!

The text must include words in a language or languages other than English, and could include imagery relating to the concept. Tidy and attractive presentation is important, but judges will look principally at the **language** in the text, rather than the quality of any images.

No entry can be larger than a sheet of A4 paper.

Pupils should write their name, age, language used, class, teacher and school on the back of their entry.

NB Entries cannot be returned, so you may wish to celebrate them before sending them in.

We reserve the right to use winning entries for display or promotional purposes and potentially for publication (including online) and will inform you accordingly through newsletters or e-bulletins.

The intention is that this might form an activity in your school around the European Day of Languages itself (26<sup>th</sup> September), so the deadline for submission of entries will be: *Wednesday, 9<sup>th</sup> October 2024.* 

Vouchers will be offered to any winners identified by the judges, for each key stage, up to and including KS5. Further prizes may also be awarded at the judges' discretion. In the event of insufficient entries of good quality in any specific key stage no prize will be awarded; the judges' decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into on decisions.

The judges are made up of the competition organisers and our supporters.
